He has been a public school music educator since 1998 and holds a B.A. degree in music from the University of South Florida. Jeff completed his Orff levels training under the instruction of Marilyn Copeland Davidson, Bob de Frece, Carol King, and Joy Yelin. He received his Masters level certification in Orff-Schulwerk under the instruction of Jane Frazee. He is an active member of the American Orff-Schulwerk Association (AOSA), and has directed numerous honors ensembles, including five-time director of the Hillsborough County honors Orff ensemble, director for the Pinellas all-county world drumming ensemble and Pasco allcounty honors Orff ensembles. He has participated on the panel of educators for FMEA Summer Institute and served on State and county music textbook adoption committees. Jeff has served as a board member and as President-Elect, President, and Past-President for the Hillsborough County Elementary Music Education Council. He has presented workshops for the Greater Tampa Bay Area Orff Chapter and school districts for Hillsborough, Pinellas, Pasco, and Sarasota counties. Jeff has also presented conference sessions at the Florida Music Educator's Association Conference, and elementary music workshops for Radford University. He composes and arranges works for Orff instruments and ensembles and is the author of the books, Great Big House and Other Folk Songs, Rhymes Rhythms and Beyond, Instrument Magic, Sing and Play The Orff Way, and several individual works and classroom resources published by Playground Music Press.
